(a) To determine if a public official is making, participating in making, or using or attempting to use hishher official position to influence a governmental decision, apply 2 Cal. Gode Regs., section 18702.1 through 18702.4 respectively.
(b) Notwithstanding subdivision (a) of this regulation, to determine if a public officiat who holds an office specified in Government Code section 87200 is making, participating in making, or using or attempting to use his or her official position to influence a governmental decision relating to an agenda item which is noticed for a meeting subject to the provisions of the Bagley-Keene Act (Government Code sections Sections 11120 et seq.) or the Brown Act (Government Code sections 54950 et seq.) apply 2 Cal. Code Regs. sections 18702.1(a)(1) (a)(4), 18702.2, 18702.3, 18702.4, and 18702.5.

## [Text Inserted from Regulation 18705]

(a) In order to determine if a governmental decision's reasonably foreseeable financial effect on a financial interest is material, for a governmental decision that affects:
(1) A financial interest in a business entity, - apply Regulation 18705.1;
(2 A financial interest in real property, - apply Regulation 18705.2;
(3) A financial interest in a source of income, - apply Regulation 18705.3;
(4) A financial interest in a source of gifts, — apply Regulation 18705.4;
(5) The public official's personal finances, or those of a member of his or her immediate family, - apply Regulation 18705.5;
(b) Special-Notwithstanding Regulations 18705.1 through 18705.5, the financial effect of a governmental decision is not material if it is nominal, inconsequential, or insignificant.
