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- (a) Database Design. To permit compatibility among systems, an agency's electronic filing system for statements of economic interests under Section 87500.2 shall accept a filing using a system that permits data to be exported to a common file format such as comma separated values (CSV) or Extensible Markup Language (XML), allowing the data to be easily retrieved on a variety of spreadsheet and database applications.
- (b) Security Features. In addition to the requirements set forth in Section 87500.2, an agency's electronic filing system for statements of economic interests shall include the necessary industry best practices to ensure that the security and integrity of the data and information contained in a statement of economic interests electronically filed through the agency's system is not jeopardized or compromised by using technology such as incorporating technology, including but not limited to secured authentication, complex password requirements, secure sockets layer (SSL), Web encryption, enterprise-level network firewalls, database encryption, password encryption, system hardening procedures, a back up backup and restore process, disaster recovery capability, and the capability to completely redact or omit information from an Internet posting of the form.
- (c) Data Exchange Requirements. An agency's electronic filing system shall meet the data exchange requirements necessary to autonomously transfer data between the agency's system and the Commission's electronic filing system.
- (c) (d) Proposal and Fee. Pursuant to Section 87500.2, an An agency seeking approval and certification of an electronic filing system for statements of economic interests its electronic filing system shall submit the following to the Commission:

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1	(1) A description of the electronic filing system that the agency proposes to use with			
2	documentation showing compliance with the technical requirements of Section 87500.2, 87500.2			
3	and this regulation, including system overviews, specifications, and network diagrams.			
4	(2) A certification fee of \$1,000 payable to the Fair Political Practices Commission.			
5	(d) (e) Review Duration. The Commission shall complete the review and certification			
6	process as soon as practicable after receiving the agency's submitted proposal.			
7	(e) (f) Redaction. A local agency that chooses to post statements of economic interests			
8	online shall redact the address, telephone number, and signature block of a public official's			
9	statement of economic interests from the cover page before it is made available on the Internet.			
10	An agency may, at the request of a public an official, redact additional information from the			
11	official's statement of economic interests for purposes of the Internet posting if the public official			
12	has a reasonable privacy concern related to an individual's address, or a family member's name,			
13	or other personally identifiable information as set forth in Regulation 18313.6.			
14	(f) (g) Updates. An agency shall be required to update its electronic filing system			
15	annually to conform to the Commission-approved changes to the statement of economic interests			
16	forms.			
17	(g) (h) Re-certification. An agency shall be required to request apply to the Commission			
18	for re-certification of its <u>electronic filing</u> system by resubmitting a description of the <u>electronic</u>			
19	filing system each time, as required by subdivision (d)(1), if either of the following events			
20	occurs:			
21	(1) a A significant change of product or system architecture takes place-or.			

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(2) five Five years have passed since the initial or most recent Commission certification.

- 1 (h) (i) Re-certification Fee. The Commission may, at its discretion, charge a \$1,000 re-
- 2 certification fee, depending on the complexity of the its review of the agency's electronic filing
- 3 system <del>review</del>.
- 4 (h) Failure (j) Rejection and Revocation. An agency's failure to comply with subdivisions
- 5 (f) or (g) or (h), above, or to pay the re-certification fee authorized by subdivision (i), may result
- 6 in revocation of an agency's system certification the Commission's rejection of the agency's re-
- 7 <u>certification application or its revocation of its previous certification of the agency's electronic</u>
- 8 <u>filing system</u>.

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
